Sundance 2020: Epicentro marvelous, intri portrait of Cuba's 'little prophets'

Introducing her 1995 anthology, *Bridges to Cuba / Puentes a Cuba*, Cuban-Ame anthropologist and author Ruth Behar wrote that her collection is "a meeting pl space, a castle in the sand, an imaginary homeland. It is a space for reconciliat speculation and renewal."

Receiving its Sundance premiere, the documentary *Epicentro*, directed by awar Hubert Sauper, achieves with equally compelling effect a similar goal in the film American viewers a more balanced perspective than what international affairs and scholars typically achieve in their simplistic assessments.

Sauper, in *Epicentro*, illuminates many fresh perspectives about an island natio paradoxical as it is exotic and unique in its sociopolitical place in the global com


The voices featured are prominently those of young people in Cuba, pragmatic, dreamers who are the first generation in the country to experience their lives it era. Sauper calls them "little prophets." They are astute about the historical lecton continues to shape their formative years: the revolutionary principles that brou Castro to power more than 60 years ago and a complex relationship with the U with the events surrounding the 1898 explosion of the USS Maine.

The title *Epicentro* concisely describes the frame for Sauper's thematic epiphan Americas, Cuba is the geopolitical nexus of the slave trade, the era of colonialis imperialism, and the advent of a global community and marketplace. The young Cubans know their history — and not just the revolution leading to to This includes the sinking of the USS Maine, which precipitated the Spanish-Amethe culminating event as U.S. forces raised the flag on the hills overlooking Guarea that since then has remained under American control.

The 'little prophets,' for example, know quite a lot about a bit of U.S. history th could recite immediately or recognize from history. The reference is the Platt Al 1901, which stipulated the conditions for the withdrawal of U.S. forces from Cu American colonial dominance over the island that would last until the Cuban Re

These 'little prophets' are not just smart but they also are rich in song, dance a talents. Their hunger to find outlets for creative expression is just as intense as American peers experience but these young Cubans also do not have the same social media. Their instincts for cinema are innate, and they absorb and proces early cinema to which they are introduced. They are fascinated by Sauper's iPh these 'little prophets' create miniature videos on the spot, impressing the direc natural abilities.

Joining Sauper in the film is the Spanish-English actor Oona Castilla Chaplin, th

actor Geraldine Chaplin and the granddaughter of Charlie Chaplin. She also is t granddaughter of Eugene O'Neill. Chaplin interacts with these 'little prophets' s offering acting tips. She also sings in the film, accenting the outstanding music Zsuzsanna Varkonyi and Maximilian 'Twig' Turnbull.

Sauper also foreshadows the impending impact of the climate crisis, achieving spoken text. Instead, scenes of waves crashing along the Cuban shores with ar ferocity appear throughout the film. This is why Schmidl's book is connected es Sauper's thematic intentions in *Epicentro*. As Schmidl writes, "The term of effic things right') needs to be extended to that of effectiveness ('doing the right thing remain stuck in doing the wrong things right."
